Litter Pick - Update

A further litter pick with a small group of people was held on the morning of 2 February at Furnace Woods layby along the A595, where the PC had arranged for a bin to be installed. As of 2 February this layby and the roadway several hundred metres either side was cleared of the now familiar accumulation of containers including many cans and crisp wrappers. Much of this packaging had degraded with weather and traffic into small pieces of plastic, unfortunately ideal for washing into the Duddon and then out to sea. Now this area has been cleared the accumulation of litter in this location will be monitored: hopefully with the bin in place there will be much less litter thrown into the layby and roadway?!

Empty Homes Update

The Copeland Borough Council Empty Homes Officer has been working to follow the process for bringing the four empty homes identified in Millom Without back into beneficial use. In February 2020 the details of a contract for legal works by a local firm using the Enforced Sales procedures are to be finalised and presented to Copeland Borough Council Executive. The work has to take account of costings for work undertaken by Copeland should the property not proceed to sale and the owner agrees to undertake work or pay fines/fees. The intention is for the contract to be in place from April 2020 to allow this work to be progressed. Further information will be provided as this work by Copeland Borough Council progresses.

Are you Serious About Your Septic Tank?

Some of us are aware that the law regarding septic tanks changed in three significant ways on 1st January. The Parish Council has organised two public meetings so you can discover whether you are complying. We have invited representatives from the Regulatory Authorities and local contractors. They will speak for only a short time and give you more than an hour to ask questions. The meetings will be on Tuesday 24th March at 5pm in the Hill Village Hall, repeated at 7:30pm in Thwaites Village Hall. It would be helpful if you had read www.callofnature.info before you come
