Public invited to view latest plans for Millom's Iron Line project



THE latest plans to sensitively transform a popular Millom beauty spot into an inspirational and fully inclusive, nationally significant visitor attraction will be available to view at a special public drop in session.

Artist's impressions will accompany an update on various aspects of The Iron Line, a project that proposes to enhance the unique nature reserve at RSPB Hodbarrow following

community engagement sessions last year.

When completed, The Iron Line is expected to attract up to 100,000 visits per year.



The Iron Line scheme will incorporate upgrades to the significant landmarks alongside a new welcome centre which will include a café/bar, retail space and events room and adjacent parking for around 80 vehicles. Upwards of 7km of walking and cycling routes will also be enhanced as part of the project.

The drop in session will be held on Saturday, March 4 at the Millom Guide Hall from 12.30pm-6.30pm.

WORK on an impressive new beach café at Silecroft will soon begin.

Copeland Borough Council has appointed Roland Hill Ltd to carry out the work, and building will begin on February 13. It is hoped the new café and toilets will be ready for use by late September.

The building will have spectacular views and room for 30 diners. There will be an external shower for beach users, and a Changing Places disabled toilet and changing facility - only the second in the Lake District National Park. The building will have two courtyards, offering shelter regardless of the wind direction, and there will be additional accessible toilets available to beach users as well as café customers.

Silecroft Beach Cafe is part of the Connecting Cumbria's Hidden Coast Programme, which is led by Copeland Council and funded by the Coastal Communities Fund and Sellafield Ltd. Once complete, the building will be handed over to the council's community partner Whicham Parish Council, which will own the building and oversee the operation of the café.

Copeland's Elected Mayor, Mike Starkie, said: "We see this design-led café as critical in attracting new visitors to coastal Copeland, as well as catering for the significant number of locals who use this beautiful beach.

"I am really pleased that Whicham Parish Council is partnering with us on this. On completion, Silecroft will have a beautiful building in a unique setting that will serve as both a place for the community and an attraction for visitors." A spokesperson for Whicham Parish Council said: "We are excited that the community-led vision for this cafe is about to be realised. It will enhance the unique location of this special place for locals, visitors and especially people with disabilities and their carers. We are grateful to the funding bodies and Copeland Borough Council for leading the build."

Gary McKeating, Head of Community and Development at Sellafield Ltd, added: "Connecting Cumbria's Hidden Coast is a key programme of activity that is helping to diversify the West Cumbria coastal offer to residents and visitors alike. It's also pleasing to see a local contractor chosen to undertake the work. We look forward to seeing another piece of the hidden coast puzzle in place."

The vision for a cafe evolved after residents included it in their Community Plan in 2011. Since then the community-led project has been closely supported by the Economic Development team at Copeland Borough Council, and a temporary cafe was built in 2017. Its success proved the business case for a permanent structure.

The café is designed by Konishi Gaffney Architects and full planning permission was granted by the Lake District National Park Authority in June 2021.

Turner Prize winning artist Martin Boyce has designed the metal security shutters for the café as part of Deep Time – the arts programme of the Connecting Cumbria's Hidden Coast project.

Silecroft beach is in the south west corner of the Lake District National Park, in Copeland. It is the only bathing beach in the Lake District National Park. The expansive, pale sands are overlooked by Black Combe fell to the north and there are spectacular views across the Irish Sea towards the Isle of Man.

This project is part of the Connecting Cumbria's Hidden Coast programme, which is led by Copeland Borough Council and funded with £1.15m from Sellafield Ltd and more than £1m from the government's Coastal Communities Fund. It aims to inspire visitors to Copeland's coast, drive economic growth, promote health and wellbeing and raise awareness of the area in the rest of the UK. As well as the new beach cafe at Silecroft, there is a running festival, several new cycle and footpath routes and an extensive arts programme, Deep Time.



More News for Silecroft - Landmark Art Announcement

A 30-metre steel elliptical basin will be installed on the mud flats, like some sort of strange sea vessel which has just landed. At high tide it will be submerged and when the tide goes out the water will remain in the basin.

Changes to local government in Cumbria - Cumberland Council takes over from 1st April

On 1 April 2023 local government in Cumbria will change.

The current six district councils, along with Cumbria County Council, will be replaced by two new 'unitary' councils.

In the area currently covered by Allerdale Borough Council, Carlisle City Council and Copeland Borough Council a new authority, Cumberland Council, will be created.

What will the changes mean?

From April 2023 Cumberland Council will be responsible for providing all the services currently delivered in those areas by the three city and borough councils and the county council.

That means everything from your waste and recycling collections to highways and planning matters, adult social care and parking will all be looked after by the new Cumberland Council

In the Barrow, Eden and South Lakeland council areas a second new authority, Westmorland and Furness Council, will be taking over providing services. You can find out more on the Westmorland and Furness Council website.

Government announced its decision to create two new unitary councils for Cumbria in July 2021. Since then work has been ongoing to ensure a smooth switch to the new councils next year.

New Government Requirement -Voting ID

New UK Government requirements mean that people must show photo ID, when voting at a polling station, in the upcoming parish council elections on May 4.

Acceptable forms of identification are a passport, driving licence, Blue Badge, an identity card with a PASS mark, certain concessionary travel cards, a biometric immigration document, a defence identity card and a national identity card.
