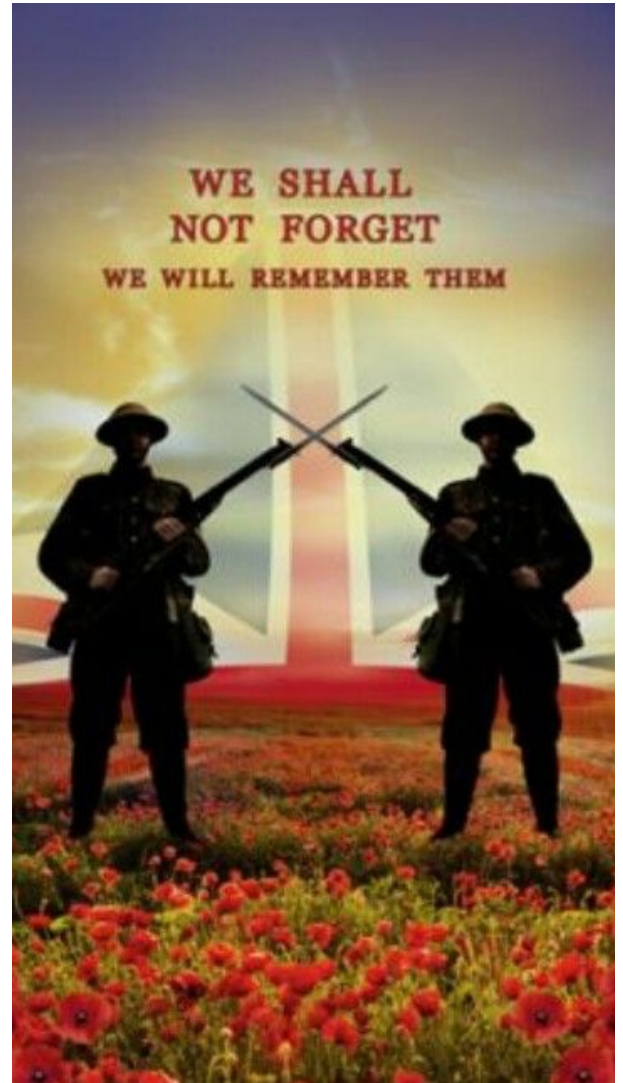

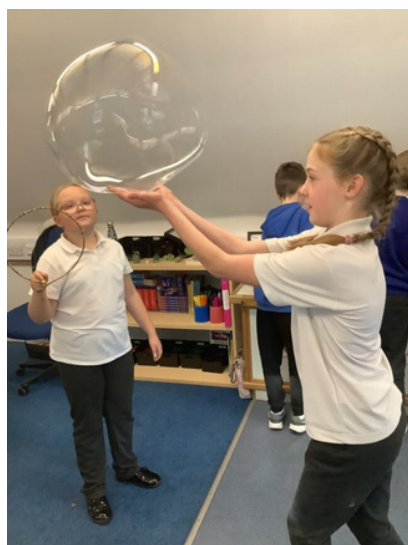


Thwaites School - Creating challenging and exciting opportunities to learn



Thwaites School, under the leadership of the New Head Teacher, Mark Redhead are continuing to explore new and exciting opportunities to make learning both exciting and challenging.

The children in Class Two (years 3 and 4) have been learning all about the Romans this half-term and visited the Roman Baths at Ravenglass to appreciate just how close to home the Romans came. As well as this they also stopped at Muncaster Castle to enjoy the gardens and park making the trip a fun and educational day out.



The photo are of Class Three (years 5 and 6) enjoying a STEM day delivered by Unit 3. The children have been learning about the properties of different materials during this half-term and this was an enrichment activity to deepen their learning. Amongst other things, the children made slime and blew bubbles. The children really enjoyed the day and the cheers could be heard right through the school



Class One (Nursery, Reception, Year One and Two) have been learning all about their school this half-term which has involved learning about maps and mapping. To bring the topic to a close they put their skills to the test, following clues and using compasses to solve a school treasure hunt. The children applied their skills brilliantly and solved the clues to find the treasure, a notebook and pencil each.

Returning at 13.20 from Stand A at The Mall.

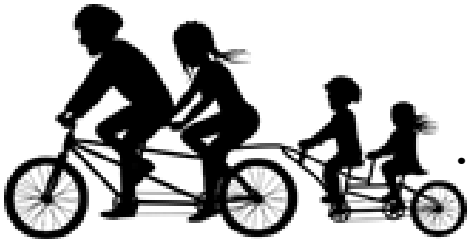
